


## **CONSIDERATION**

When listening to their response to your evangelistic question, it may not be black or white. Listen very carefully and consider their response. Not every response is a green light for a gospel presentation














Once you have the green light it time to GO! God has gifted you with the opportunity to share the gospel!



You've presented the gospel. Now it's time to ask: "Is there any reason why, right now, you wouldn't call on Jesus to be your Lord & Savior?" If so, guide them through a simple prayer of salvation:

## INTERSESSION


It starts with prayer! Do you know someone who needs to know Jesus. Start by praying for that person daily! Here is a simple acrostic to use as you pray for someone who is lost:

## CONVERSATION

Ideally, you already have some type of relationship with the person you are sharing the gospel with, but if not, that's ok. But don't just blurt out "DO YOU KNOW JESUS?" first thing. Engage in a sincere conversation.

- Ask open-ended questions.
- LISTEN to what they say!
- Mirror back highlights of what they say so they know you were listening.
- If conversations seem hard, use this F.I.R.E. acrostic to start a conversation that evolves deeper as you go.



## THE QUESTION

There are lots of ways to get down to the nitty gritty of asking a person if they know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. And likely, none of them are wrong.

That being said, you don't want to use fancy "religious" words. You should keep it simple, but clear.

If you've gotten this far into a conversation with someone that you think may be lost, it's time for an exploratory evangelistic question. Here is a great way to broach the subject that most people won't find intimidating:
